PERMANENT RESOLUTION NO. 114-22

A RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE FROM THE UNENCUMBERED BALANCE AND AMEND THE CERTIFICATE WITH THE COUNTY AUDITOR IN THE LDOT FUND (2008) FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO BRANDEN C. MEYER FAIRFIELD COUNTY CLERK OF COURTS FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF A BOND FOR PAYMENT OF DAMAGES TO THE CITY OF LANCASTER DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (LDOT)

WHEREAS, this request is the result of duplicate payments made to pay for damages to City property caused by Kristopher Schleichardt; and

WHEREAS, a pay-in for the amount of Three Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Nine Dollars and Forty-Four Cents (\$3,239.44) was completed on July 19, 2022 by the Law Director's Office who received it from Mr. Schleichardt's insurance as a result of damage he caused to a traffic signal on October 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2022, LDOT completed a pay-in in the amount of Three Thousand Six Dollars (\$3,006.00) for restitution ordered to the City in the case of State vs. Kristopher Schleichardt from the bond he paid to the Fairfield County Common Pleas Court; and

WHEREAS, since these two payments were for the same damage, the Fairfield County Common Pleas Court needs to be reimbursed for the duplicate payment;

BE IT RESOLVED BY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, STATE OF OHIO

SECTION 1. That the City of Lancaster Auditor amend the Certificate of Appropriations with the County Auditor in the amount of Three Thousand Six Dollars (\$3,006.00) in the LDOT Fund (2008).

SECTION 2. That the City of Lancaster Auditor appropriate from the unencumbered balance in expense account number 2008.7500.54003 (Damage – Streets) in the amount of Three Thousand Six Dollars (\$3,006.00).

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
